



CONFLICT MINERALS POLICY

Klas Telecom fully supports efforts to eliminate the use of Conflict Minerals from improper sources that could support human rights abuses in the DRC Region and has engaged in the process of obtaining information from its metal suppliers concerning the origin of the metals that are used to manufacture Klas Telecom products. "Conflict Minerals" include tantalum, tin, gold and tungsten.

In July 2010, the United States Congress passed the Dodd-Frank Financial Reform Bill. Section 1502 of this bill requires all U.S. publicly traded companies and their suppliers to disclose their use and sources of Conflict Minerals.

Klas Telecom, like many companies in the technology and electronic industries, uses such metals to manufacture electronic products. Each of these metals has specific electrical properties which are necessary for the function of our products.

Klas Telecom does not directly source Conflict Minerals from mines or smelters. Therefore, it relies on the information provided by its suppliers regarding their sourcing of metals. Klas Telecom expects its suppliers to source materials from socially responsible suppliers and that all its suppliers will comply with the Dodd-Frank requirements and provide all necessary declarations and supporting information. Suppliers must pass these requirements through to their supply chain if they do not source directly from mines or smelters and determine the source of the Conflict Minerals used in the component or product that Klas Telecom purchases.

Klas Telecom will assess future business with suppliers who are not cooperative with the conflict-free sourcing initiative and not compliant with this Policy. Klas Telecom will continue to regularly perform due diligence and survey its suppliers to verify compliance with this Policy. Klas Telecom is committed to ethical practices and compliance with applicable laws and regulations wherever it does business.
